The Rules of Golf - Bill Martin

FYI, for those that maintain a CDGA Handicap (and those that do not):

From the USGA website Handicapping FAQ's section: Adjusting Hole Scores for Equitable Stroke Control (ESC)

ESC is an adjustment of individual hole scores (for handicap purposes) in order to make handicaps more representative of a player's potential ability. ESC is applied after the round and is only used when the actual score or the most likely score exceeds a player's maximum number. ESC sets a limit to the number of strokes a player can take on a hole depending on Course Handicap. Apply ESC to all scores, including tournament scores.
